BEHAVIORAL HEALTH URGENT CARE - UnityPoint Health

Provides services to children and adults in central Iowa. Services include, but are not limited to: mental health services, psychiatric evaluation and assessment, addiction medicine, crisis services, community resources, onsite coordination for additional interventions coordinated with behavioral health agencies in central Iowa. BROADLAWNS MEDICAL CENTER

- Crisis Stabilization provide short-term services provided in a facility-based setting. Designed for voluntary individuals who are in need of a safe, secure environment less intensive and restrictive than the hospital. The mission is to stabilize and reintegrate the individual back into the community. The 5-day crisis stabilization facility is a welcoming and comfortable environment conducive to recovery. This is an unlocked setting and a voluntary program. Open 24/7 at 1730 Arlington Avenue, Des Moines.
- Mobile Crisis Unit Provides community-based assessments and short term crisis management for individuals who are experiencing a mental health crisis. The Mobile Crisis Team is staffed with behavioral health specialists including social workers and registered nurses. The team can stabilize clients in their home and complete a mental health assessment on scene.

CLIVE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Provides compassionate care for those who struggle with a behavioral health disorder or co-occurring disorders. Our care providers work closely with patients and their loved ones to help achieve their personal treatment goals. Based on a clinical assessment, each patient's treatment plan is customized to meet their specific needs and promote better outcomes. Our mission is to help them stabilize behavior and emotions and leave the hospital with new, effective coping methods. To promote ongoing progress after a patient leaves our care, we initiate community referrals for continued care after discharge. The average length of stay in our hospital is five to seven days, but vary based on individual needs. The physician, therapist, care team and the patient and their support circle collectively determine the patient's time of discharge.

CRISIS STABLIZATION - Easter Seals

Offers support to kids, families, and adults recovering from crisis. The five day program will introduce skills to assist in managing future crisis, and supporting family and other important relationships in the individual's life. Services include: A comprehensive mental health assessment, daily meeting with a Licensed Mental Health Professional, assisting with skill building and practice utilizing skills to build resiliency.
